

 - a. Select **SO Publication Name** in the dropdown menu.
 - b. Select **AU Author** in the dropdown menu.
 - c. Type in the publication name: MIS Quarterly Executive.
 - d. Type in the author's name: Blohm.
 - e. Click the green **Search** button.


